·Too much information not being utilized

- _ Missing a coupon expiration date and not being able to use it
 - Missing real-time discount information and only noticing it later
- Too much unconfirmed information due to unknown sources
 - Not knowing who wrote the information
 - Limited information based on search or purchase history

Differences in the ability to utilize information devices create a digital divide


Not only is there a growing disparity in treatment and opportunity between those who can and cannot use computers and smart phones...
